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Mocreo: The Skinny on Travel Adapters



My Mocreo universal travel adapter travel adapter was a daily essential on a recent trip through the Northwest Passage. My camera needed a charge every night to be ready for the hundreds of photos I was taking, my laptop had to be at the ready for the myriad of notes I typed; and, most importantly, my travel kettle allowed my morning cup of tea in the cabin. Adapters are simple, but they need to be reliable and it's vital that they "adapt" to the required voltage no matter what, no matter where.

This particular adapter makes it easy. Even though slightly bulky, the prongs hold firmly in the wall even with three devices plugged into it at the same time. Worldwide plugs on the top make it easy to support small or mid-sized appliances. An extra fuse stored inside is an insightful addition, all for under \$25. The square design and the way the prongs are hidden, yet easily accessible turn this adapter into a tiny work of art. The blue light effect in the USB port makes it highly visible (sometimes a bit too visible at night if you are in a small space).

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
